



## Why minor in History?

This minor is designed to address the needs of students in other fields who wish to gain a broad base in the humanities and social sciences by incorporating historical perspective into their majors and thus enhance their ability to reach higher levels of achievement in their own professional specialization. We believe that a history minor would enrich upper level history courses for all students because of the increased variety of perspectives brought to such classes by students majoring in different disciplines.

## How to declare a History Minor:

1. Pick up the declaration of minor form from the CAP Center on the 2nd floor of Savitz Hall.
2. Bring it to Dr. Blake or another faculty member in the History department. Fill it out in consultation with that faculty member.
3. Return the form to the CAP Center, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor of Savitz Hall and you are all set to start taking courses towards a History Minor.

## The Course of Study for a Minor in History:

The curriculum will consists of 18 credits in history, including:

1. At least three courses (9 credits) at the 300 or 400 level
2. At least one course at either the introductory or advanced level must be taken in each of the following areas of concentration: **American** (3credits), **European** (3 credits) and **Global** (3 credits).
3. Minors must maintain at least a 2.5 GPA in all history courses.
4. Minors are encouraged to take Historical Methods (Hist.05.306).
5. Students pursuing the minor will plan their courses in collaboration with a Department of History advisor in addition to an advisor from their major.
