**SPANISH MINOR**

The Spanish Minor, which is officially declared in the Foreign Languages and Literatures Department, offers a flexible curriculum with many opportunities for selection of courses in the Spanish language and in Spanish and Spanish American civilization, culture, literature and linguistics. It provides a general background for future professional studies and advanced degrees in Spanish and work in a wide variety of fields, such as social, administrative and governmental work, as well as international business.

The Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures strongly urges potential Spanish Minors to make an appointment for a **Spanish Placement Exam**, so that they can begin the program at the appropriate level. In order to satisfy the requirements for the Spanish Minor, students must take 18 SH credits in Spanish. These 18 SH may be completed through:

- Taking the courses listed below, each of which is 3 SH credits (All courses must be passed with a letter grade of “C-” or better and no courses may be taken P/NC.)
- Transferring up to 9 SH into the Spanish Minor, including up to 6 SH from the CLEP Exam in Spanish (equivalent to Spanish I and II – contact Mark Matalucci, [matalucci@rowan.edu](mailto:matalucci@rowan.edu) at the Center for Academic Success, Savitz Hall for more information). The maximum 9 SH credits transferred into the Spanish Minor also include coursework obtained through Study Abroad, as long as the Study Abroad courses are taught in Spanish. Students who have taken more than 9 SH during Study Abroad may use the additional credits as Free Electives. Students planning to Study Abroad must meet with their Spanish Advisor in order to determine course equivalents.

The following 3 SH courses may be used toward the Spanish Minor:

<b>Oral Spanish</b> (SPAN 05.305) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.211 or waiver)
<b>Spanish Reading and Composition</b> (SPAN 05.212) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.211 or waiver)
<b>Spanish Phonetics</b> (SPAN 05.300) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.212)
<b>*Appreciation of Hispanic Literature</b> (SPAN 05.301) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.212)
<b>Spanish For Business</b> (SPAN 05.312) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.212)
<b>Spanish For Medical Personnel</b> (SPAN 05.313) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.212)
<b>Introduction to Spanish Translation</b> (SPAN 05.340) .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.212)
<b>Any other 300/400 level courses in Spanish</b> .....	(pre-requisite SPAN 05.301)

\*All students enrolled in “Appreciation of Hispanic Literature” are required to take the STAMP exam as a check on student progress in gaining Spanish language proficiency.
