FRENCH MINOR

The French Minor is an intensive program of study which offers courses in French language, civilization, culture and literature. It also provides a general background for further study in French or for future professional pursuits in fields such as international business, education, and social, administrative and governmental work. Previous high school preparation in the language is desirable, but not required. The French Minor should be declared at the CAP Center in Savitz Hall.

In order to satisfy the requirements for the French Minor, students must finish the minor by graduation and take 18 SH credits in French. These 18 SH may be made up of any combination of the following 3 s.h. course options:

*All courses must be passed with a letter grade of C-or better. No courses may be taken P/NC.

*Up to 9 s.h. may be transferred into the Minor, including from the CLEP Exam.

**Course semester hour requirements for Elementary French I and II may be fulfilled by successfully passing the CLEP Exam for French. Students who receive satisfactory scores on the CLEP Exam may receive up to 6 s.h. toward the French Minor, corresponding to Elementary French I and II. The Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures strongly urges potential French minors to make an appointment for a French Placement Exam, so they can begin the program at the appropriate level. A student who has had two or more years of French in high school may start the minor with the Intermediate courses and may take additional upper level courses in French to fulfill the minor requirements.

All Elementary and Intermediate Foreign Language courses can be used to fulfill general education requirements.
