Title: Proposal To Change Specialization in Accounting

Sponsors: Dr. Robert E. Pritchard, Chair, Accounting and Finance representing the Accounting/Finance faculty

Scope: Increase the Accounting Specialization by 3 sh from 27 sh to 30 sh, and require the new proposed course "Law For Accountants."

Relation To Curriculum: This will affect only those students specializing in Accounting.

Prerequisites: Not applicable. See course proposal "Law For Accountants."

Suggested Time: Implement Fall 1986

Resource Requirements: See proposal "Law For Accountants."

Rationale: The Business Administration core is being modified consistant with the consultants recommendations for AACSB accreditation. The two existing law courses, Principles of Law I and II, are being phased out. A new law course will be required of all Business Administration majors and included in the core. This will have the effect of reducing the core by three semester hours. Students specializing in Accounting need six hours of law in order to both be prepared professionally and to sit for the CPA exam. Thus, this proposal is to include a second law course in the Accounting specialization. The course will be "Law For Accountants."

Essence of Specialization: The specialization in accounting is designed to prepare GSC students for careers in preferal accounting. The only change proposed is the additional of "Law For Accountants."

Results of Consultation: All members of the Accounting faculty support this proposal. The proposal is consistant with recommendations of our consultants.

New Courses: One new course is required: "Law For Accountants."
