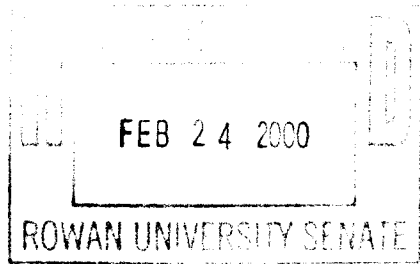

Course Title: Advanced Writing

Sponsor: Martin Itzkowitz, College Writing

Credit Hours: 3 (unchanged)

Course Level: 300 (unchanged)

Prerequisites: College Composition I and II and 45 credit hours

Suggested time and scale of implementation: Upon approval. Course to be offered each semester as is currently done.

Curricular Effect: None

Resources: No new resources required

Rationale:

The course is more appropriately perceived as intermediate rather than advanced, and the descriptor “Advanced Writing” tends to deter potential students from enrolling. “Writing with Style” presents the emphasis of the course accurately and is in keeping with titles of department courses recently approved, e.g., “The Writer’s Mind.” Prerequisites and Hegis number remain unchanged.

Consultation: No other departments are affected by this change.

## Course Description.

### Current:

Emphasizing prose style, this course builds upon the skills of organization and development covered in College Composition I and II. It gives special attention to tone, diction, sentence structure, audience, and ultimately, to the evolution of a personal voice. Students write frequently, receive instructor and peer feedback, and learn to analyze and edit both professional and non-professional essays.

### Proposed:

Emphasizing prose style, this intermediate course gives special attention to audience, tone, diction and ultimately to the evolution of a personal voice. Students examine the styles of professional writers, write frequently themselves, and receive instructor and peer feedback in a workshop environment.
