Summary of Minor Curriculum Changes to Athletic Training Specialization

I. Details

- a. Sponsors: Dr. Douglas Mann (Program Director, Athletic Training Specialization), Dr. Robert Sterner, Mr. Charles Whedon (Coordinator of Athletic Training Services) and the Department of Health and Exercise Science.

- b. To provide a summary of the proposed minor curriculum changes sent forward for consideration.

II. Curricular Effect

- a. The Athletic Training Specialization recently went through its reaccrediting process. As of August we received re-accreditation on condition that we make several curricular changes to the Athletic Training Specialization. The proposed curriculum changes to the Athletic Training Specialization are a direct reflection of CAAHEP's recommendations for re-accreditation. An overview of the Athletic Training Specialization's curriculum proposals categorizes them into three areas:
 1. Name Changes to Existing Courses
 2. Course Description Changes to Existing Courses
 3. Credit Increases for Clinical Experiences in Athletic Training I-IV

III. Rationale

a. Name Changes to Existing Courses

1. The term "athletic injuries" no longer describes the entire patient population that athletic trainers treat on a daily basis. Therefore, the National Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA) has suggested that when relating to types of injuries, that the term "athletic injuries" no longer be used within course names, description or during discussion of patient populations. The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Program's (CAAHEP), the accrediting body for the Athletic Training Specialization, site visit team recommended that we make these changes to course titles. Consequently, course title changes will make certain that the athletic training education program is in accordance with CAAHEP standards and guidelines for accreditation.

b. Course Description Changes to Existing Courses

1. CAAHEP also recommended that we develop a more encompassing course description for several of our courses in order to make students more aware of the content in these courses. Therefore, the new course descriptions have been altered to meet accreditation recommendations and standards.

c. Credit Increase for Clinical Experiences in Athletic Training I-IV

1. The credit increases for these classes are the result of explicit recommendations by CAAHEP. During our re-accreditation site visit, it was abundantly made clear that the workload for these courses was too

much for the credit load assigned. Thus, increasing the credit load from 1-credit to 3-credits for the Clinical Experiences in Athletic Training courses will ensure that the Athletic Training Education Program continues to remain in compliance with the CAAHEP accreditation recommendations and standards.

2. These proposed changes would appear to increase the program's total credit hours by 8. However, our program will actually decrease to 120 credits with the new General Education model changes (43 credits, please see AT Curriculum Content Attachment) and the Athletic Training Specialization curriculum changes. 3. Additionally, students have also consistently suggested that the credit load for the Clinical Experiences in Athletic Training III is too low, based on the workload assigned to any other 1 credit course on campus.
