2. RATIONALE:

a. Statement of need: This course is to be a part of the new Science/Math Specialization within the Liberal Studies major. Its content is at the appropriate level but it should have Chemistry of Everyday Life as its prerequisite to ensure the background of the students taking it is appropriate and consistent. There are other students who may find this topic of interest but who may be science majors and have taken Chemistry I as part of their major requirements and we would like to leave the course open to them as well. The content of Chemistry I is more than adequate to serve as a prerequisite.

b. Statement of curricular effect: It is expected that this course will enroll only those students taking the Liberal Studies major. Those few science majors who take it for other reasons will not receive major credit for it.

3. RESULTS OF CONSULTATION:

These changes are in accord with the Liberal Studies Committee developing the Science/Math Specialization. Members of this committee include representatives from all science and math departments.
