The Health and Physical Education Curriculum for Men and Women

Majors in this curriculum are certified to teach health and physical education in both elementary and secondary schools. Candidates for this major curriculum must possess an excellent scholastic record, excellent neuromuscular skill development in several areas such as team sports, individual and dual activities, swimming, gymnastics and/or dance and leadership qualities. Students are required to attend clinics and workshops offered by the department and to participate in either intramural or intercollegiate sports each quarter, except during the practicum and responsible teaching experience.
