2. Rationale:
 - a. Need: This course was a required course in the Pre-Physical Therapy Specialization in the Department of Health and Exercise Science. When the specialization was dropped approximately seven years ago by then Glassboro State College secondary to the recommendation of the Strategic Planning Committee, the course continued as a required course in the Athletic Training Specialization. Since then the scope of the course has expanded to a broader study of the health care system in the United States. In addition to the practice of physical therapy, other areas of investigation that have been included are the professions of athletic training, occupation therapy, and orthotist and prosthetist. Therefore, the proposed new title more appropriately describes the present course content.
 - b. Curricular Effect: No change in the total semester hour requirement for the Athletic Training Specialization.
