Course Outline

400/500 Level      Legal Aspects of Developing New Jersey's Coastal Region      2 Credit

I. Brief Description of the Course

Traditional federal, state and local resource management relationships were radically altered with passage of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972. Legal theory, legislation and regulation related to coastal zone management will be examined, primarily from the New Jersey perspective, although the federal program and programs from other states will also be examined.

Prerequisite: An interest in coastal and marine environmental affairs.

II. General Purpose of the Course

To provide participants with an overview of the legal and regulatory structure affecting allocation of coastal resources.

III. Specific Objectives of Course

- A. To acquaint participants with federal and state coastal zone management programs.
- B. Evaluate the scope and limitations of New Jersey's coastal zone management plan.
- C. Examine pertinent legal doctrines and theories affecting land and water use in the coastal zone.

IV. Content and Scope of the Course

- A. Discussion of coastal zone boundaries and the resources involved.
- B. Discussion of pressure resulting from multiple and conflicting uses of the coastal zone.
- C. Specific topics to be addressed include:
  1. Public Trust Doctrine
  2. Riparian Rights
  3. Constitutional Considerations
  4. Shore Protection and Development

Lectures and class discussions; suggested readings; field trips.
