Minor Curriculum Change, Process A

Remove Spanish Civilization & Culture (1105.320) and Spanish American Civilization & Culture (1105.324) as prerequisites for higher-level (300 and 400) Spanish courses

Sponsor: Department of Foreign Languages & Literatures

Rationale

The new entrance to the major sequence, Spanish Reading & Composition (1105.212), followed by Appreciation of Hispanic Literature (1105.301) will replace the civilization and culture classes as prerequisites to higher level (300 and 400) study. The Department has found that students coming out of Spanish Reading & Composition (1105.212) are often insufficiently prepared for the reading and writing-intensive content-based courses that deal with Spanish and Latin American history. We are adding another writing-intensive course, Appreciation of Hispanic Literature (1105.301), to help bridge the gap between grammar/vocabulary learning and active note-taking and essay-writing in our upper-level courses. Students will be encouraged, but not obligated, to take both civilization and culture classes as soon as possible after completing Appreciation of Hispanic Literature. (1105.301) Both courses will still be required courses for the Spanish major. Students will thus have more flexibility in their schedules and the Department will be able to offer these courses every third semester, instead of every semester, as we have been doing in recent years. Civilization and culture classes may be taken in any order.
