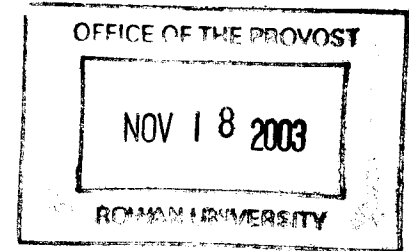

Proposal 5: Give 300-level status to Spanish Phonetics, 1105.200 and French Phonetics, 1102.200. New HEGIS numbers: 1105.300 and 1102.300.

Sponsors: Department of Foreign Languages & Literatures

Rationale: At the 200 level, most students lack sufficient command of the target language to be able to benefit from the exercises in diction and listening comprehension that are routinely assigned in these courses. Although the department has offered these courses at the 200 level for many years, we have found that students at this stage do not have the necessary language awareness to master the material covered.

Curricular Effect: None; with a skills-appropriate level, students will be able to successfully meet academic challenges, resulting in less frustration and/or a need to drop the course.
