I. WOMEN IN RUSSIAN LITERATURE
Department of Foreign Languages

II. ESSENCE:

1. Undergraduate course
2. Semester hours credit: 3
3. Course Level: Freshmen, Sophomore, Junior, Senior
4. Prerequisites: None. Open to all students.
5. Position: An additional elective course which would be appropriate to Women's Studies.
6. Suggested Time and Scale of Implementation: It could be given as an intensive course during Intersession or during the semester, beginning in the Spring, 1975.

III. OTHER DETAILS:

1. Staff and Resources: There is one Foreign Language Department faculty member qualified to teach this course.
2. Library Facilities and Needs: Already adequate.
3. Space Needs: Any classroom
4. Uniqueness: This course will present the image of the Russian woman from different social strata in the 18th, 19th and 20th century through the insights which Russian literature (in translation) provides. The image and role of women in Russian society and culture will be examined in the context of cultural, intellectual and social history. The life styles and expectations of pre-revolutionary Russian women will be compared with those of the contemporary Soviet women.
5. Specific Objectives: This course will specifically deal with the presentation of women in the Russian and Soviet novel, short story and drama. Reality and fiction will be explored against the background of ideology.

IV. RATIONALE: This course will be an important contribution to the Women's Studies Program. By studying the position of the Russian woman, the student will become more aware of the position of the American woman.

V. CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT: This course is proposed as an undergraduate course within the area of General Education, and as a contribution to the Women's Studies Program. One member of the Foreign Language Department is highly qualified to teach it, and it is hoped that the course can be offered in the Spring of 1975. Library holdings are at present adequate and no special resources will be required.
