Advice for Potential Spanish Majors:

- Prospective students and internal transfers must schedule the **STAMP Placement Test*** with Dr. Marilyn Manley, Placement Coordinator (manley@rowan.edu) to ensure proper course placement. Upon receipt of the placement result, they should make an appointment with Dr. Anthony Robb, Chair and Academic Advisement Coordinator (robb@rowan.edu / 856-256-4500 X 3467) to go over major requirements and their starting point in the program.
- Students, declared majors as well as non-matriculated students who tentatively place at levels equivalent to the OPI's Advanced Low, will not be permitted to take the Applied Spanish elective, Oral Spanish (SPAN 05.305) or the required Advanced Spanish Conversation (SPAN 05.411).
- Non-declared students considering declaring a Spanish major should likewise schedule the **STAMP Placement Test** and an interview with the Academic Advisement Coordinator as outlined above.
- Students are permitted to declare the Spanish major at any level though completion of the program in a specified timeframe will vary according to the placement level.
- Students who choose Spanish as a major and begin their studies below the Spanish Reading and Composition (SPAN05.212) level without strong high school or other preparation can not be guaranteed completion of the major in four years.
- Transfer students are not guaranteed completion of the Spanish major in two years.
- Students begin to earn major credit at the Reading and Composition (SPAN05.212) level, followed sequentially by Appreciation of Hispanic Literature (SPAN05.301).
- Appreciation of Hispanic Literature (SPAN05.301) is the pre-requisite for all upper-level major courses for freshmen and transfer students effective Fall 2007. During this course, majors are required once again to take the STAMP exam* as a diagnostic measure. The results of this evaluation will be discussed with individual majors.
- **There is strict adherence to pre-requisites.**
- Spanish Reading and Composition and Appreciation of Hispanic Literature are offered every semester.

*The cost of the STAMP is the student's responsibility.

- All other major elective courses are offered on a rotating basis once every three or four semesters. Students should consult the "Five-Year Projection Course Offerings Sheet Fall 2008-Spring 2013").
- Students are advised to take at least **two** 300 level courses prior to taking 400 level courses.
- The two semesters of a second foreign language should be scheduled as early as possible to permit interested students adequate time to complete a minor.
- Students interested in completing the International Studies or Honors Concentration should seek prompt advisement in course selection.
- **Study Abroad:** The Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures highly recommends a semester abroad, preferably in the spring semester of the Junior Year as well as summers abroad.
- With departmental advisement and approval, up to **eighteen** credits toward the major may be transferred into the program from abroad or from other comparable colleges / universities or other accrediting bodies. These credits must be from courses taught in Spanish and/or from a Spanish program.
- Dual degree Spanish education students should seek advisement from the College of Education with respect to their General Education and Free Elective requirements. Without careful planning, it is difficult for dual-degree students to study abroad, to finish the degree programs and to student teach in four years.
- Dependent upon enrollment, the Department makes every attempt to offer one upper level Spanish major course during the summer sessions.
- The Department makes every effort to offer a selection of late afternoon and early evening courses for non-traditional students. However, non-traditional students should not expect to complete the program exclusively in these time slots.
