Bachelor of Arts LIBERAL STUDIES: Humanities/Social Science

The Liberal Studies: Humanities/Social Science major requires students to complete courses in two program sequences; one from list of Program A Sequences (18-21 s.h) and one from list of Program B Sequences (18-24 s.h), or students may choose 2 sequences in Program A. Additionally, students must complete Free Electives (15-24 s.h) for a total of 60 s.h in the major.
