Title of Course Advanced Tennis S.H. Credit 2

Description of Course: January 9, January 26, 1978 M,T,W,Th. 7-9:30 Gyms 1,2,3.

This course is designed for the advanced player, coach or teacher. There will be an in-depth review of the basic ground strokes. Emphasis will then be placed on the spin serve, volley and overhead smash. The delicate shots: drop, slice and lob will be presented. Individual stroke analysis with instruction on how to use instant T.V. replay will be employed. Advanced drills will be demonstrated and practiced. Strategy, conditioning, and teaching techniques will be studied.

Rationale and Justification of Course Offering: This course was very successful during intersession two years ago. Advanced players, coaches and teachers will be able to improve their skills and teaching techniques. The instructor is a registered member of the U. S. Professional Tennis Association.

Topics to be Included in Course: T.V. instant replay and stroke analysis; advanced spin serve, volley and overhead smash; Davis Cup drills for advanced strokes; strategy and tennis conditioning (12 minute run); ladders, leagues, round robins and informal games; the delicate shots including drop, chip and lob; written assignments and literature exposure.

1. Objective Written Examination 2. Demonstration of Skill; 3. Demonstration of Teaching
