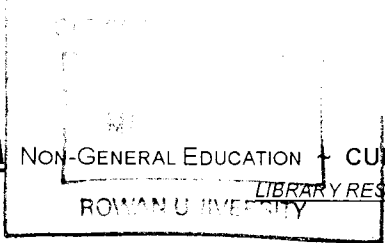

2. Rationale:

a. Statement of “Need” for Such a Change:

Eliminating Business Perspectives from the Business Core and replacing the three credits with a Business Elective requirement in the Accounting Program gives Accounting students more flexibility and exposure in their undergraduate experience.
