- Rationale:** *Business Policy* is the capstone course in the Business Administration program. It is designed to integrate the knowledge and skills developed within the *business core* courses. Four integral courses within the set of courses that comprise the *business core* are *Management Information Systems*, *Operations Management*, *Legal Environment of Business*, and *Business Perspectives*. Most other business programs, particularly those that have received or are pursuing AACSB accreditation, require these courses as prerequisites for *Business Policy*. The addition of these four prerequisite courses will enhance the learning experience of students enrolled in *Business Policy*.
