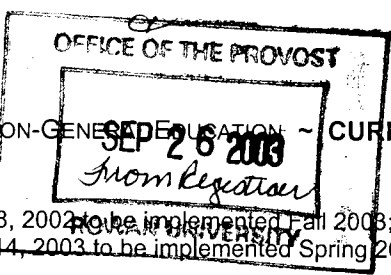

Change in Course Prerequisites

1. Details

- a. Course Title: Change in Law & Justice Studies course Criminal Justice Internship 2105356 from 1 course with 2 sections (currently 210535601 for 3 sh and 210535602 for 6 sh) to two different courses: Criminal Justice Internship I with proposed HEGIS number 2105 356 (3 sh) and Criminal Justice Internship II with proposed HEGIS number 2105357 (3 sh).
- b. Sponsors: Dr. Cynthia Line

2. Rationale:

- a. Students in Law & Justice may take up to 6 sh of internship for credit toward graduation. However, as the course is currently listed, students may not repeat the 3 sh internship option as the course will show up as a duplicated course on the student's transcript. Instead, we wish to offer students the option of taking two semesters of internship with two different HEGIS numbers. This will allow students to take all 6 sh in one semester or to split their 6 sh over any two semesters.
- b. The change should have no curricular effect.

Course Descriptions:

Criminal Justice Internship I 2105356 (3sh) (NOTE: UNCHANGED)

(Prerequisite: 1501.112)

This course provides practical immersion in a criminal justice-related agency for pre-service students; this course will for in-service students (law enforcement, courts and corrections personnel) involved placement in a social service related agency , or a research paper. A criminal justice related cooperative education experience may be substituted for the internship. In unusual circumstances other coursework may be substituted for the internship; this requires the approval of the department chair.

Criminal Justice Internships II 2105357 (3 sh) (NOTE: NEW COURSE)

(Prerequisite: 1501.112)

This course provides students with an additional opportunity to pursue practical or research experience in a criminal justice setting. Students may continue with a previously approved internship or may complete an internship in a different area of criminal justice. A criminal justice related cooperative education experience may be

substituted for the internship. This course is not intended to replace Criminal Justice Internship I (2105356) but is intended to allow students *additional* opportunities for field experience. Students are advised to complete Criminal Justice Internship I (2105356) prior to enrolling in this course. Students are also encouraged to discuss this course with the internship coordinator prior to enrolling.

Course Descriptions:

Criminal Justice Internship I 2105356 (3sh) (**NOTE: UNCHANGED**)

(Prerequisite: 1501.112)

Students are also encouraged to discuss this course with the internship coordinator prior to enrolling.
