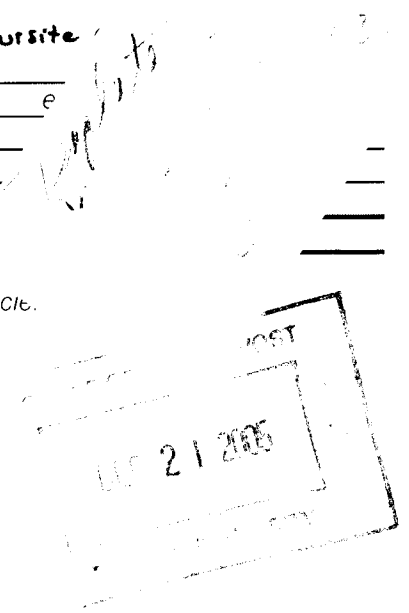

RATIONALE

a. Need for change:

Title: The term “electronic journalism” now refers to Web journalism, which is not the focus of the course. “Broadcast journalism” is the correct, current term.

Prerequisite: News Reporting I provides the skills necessary for journalists to learn broadcast news writing.

b. Curricular effect: The name change will have no curricular effect. The prerequisite change will allow students to become more prepared for radio news writing.

TITLE CHANGES

The Journalism Department has discussed and unanimously agreed to change the titles of five of our Journalism courses. The title changes more accurately describe the content of the courses. Four of these courses were originally titled many years ago; the new titles reflect the current terminology.
