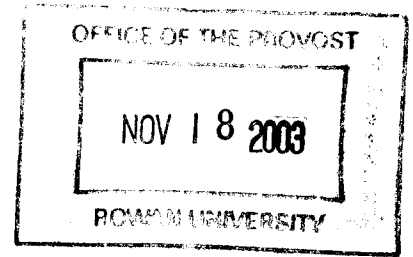

Proposal 4: Rename Foundations of the French Language 1102.400 and Foundations of the Spanish Language 1105.400, History of the French Language and History of the Spanish Language, respectively. Clarify catalog descriptions.

Sponsors: Department of Foreign Languages & Literatures

Rationale: The present titles are ambiguous, since the word “foundations” leads some students to believe that these are elementary language courses. The current catalog descriptions omit reference to the historical development of Spanish and French, which is an important component of these courses.

Current Rowan catalog (2002-2004)

Foundations of the French Language 1102.400 This course introduces students to the science of linguistics and to the rich fund of information in the field of general language. It also enhances their appreciation of foreign language patterns.

Foundations of the Spanish Language 1105.400 (Prerequisite: 1105.320 or waiver) This course gives students an introduction to the science of linguistics, an appreciation of several Spanish language patterns and a rich fund of information in the field of general language.
