
RE: Transfer of Geomorphology Course from Chemistry and Physics to Geography
and Anthropology

We propose moving the course in geomorphology, which already has a dual HEGIS number, from the Department of Chemistry and Physics to the Department of Geography and Anthropology. The current [Chemistry and Physics] HEGIS number is 1914-350. The proposed change would “activate” the Geography number, which is 2206-325.

RATIONALE: Geomorphology is a subject that lies on the boundary between geology and geography. In some schools responsibility for the course falls to the geology faculty. In other schools geographers teach the course. At Rowan the geology faculty taught the class for many years. After those faculty members left the College or retired, responsibility for teaching the course transferred to the geography faculty where it has remained up until now. As the primary market for the course is now among geography majors, moving the course to the department seems a logical course. This change will make it easier for the geography students to find the course in the schedule and register for it.

REQUESTED ACTION: Approve moving the course, Geomorphology [1914-350] from Chemistry and Physics to Geography and Anthropology [2206-325].
