The Department of Music requests approval of the following lecture courses from 2 to 3 semester hours. The proposed change preserves the best characteristics of the program and significantly improves a confirmed area of weakness. The proposed changes have been approved by the Department Chairman and by the Dean of Fine and Performing Arts.

RATIONALE

For sometime the Department of Music has been systematically reviewing its program with a view to eradicating those weaknesses identified by the National Association of Schools of Music in its 1972 evaluation. One recommendation made by NASM was that graduate courses, all of which carried two (2) hours should carry three (3) hours credit. The existing 2 credit allocation had been designed to permit a wide variety of courses in the specialization area and to frankly acknowledge that many of the courses in the program were techniques or applied courses. In reviewing the program it has become clear to the music faculty that an inappropriate credit hour allocation was made for lecture courses and that the 2 hour credit allocation necessarily results in insufficient depth and scope for graduate work. Thus the proposed change seeks to address both the nature of the techniques courses and the nature of the lecture courses by continuing the 2 credit hour allocation for the former and establishing a 3 credit hour allocation for the latter.

A number of obvious advantages will accrue. The graduate program will be strengthened by insuring greater depth and breadth in all lecture
