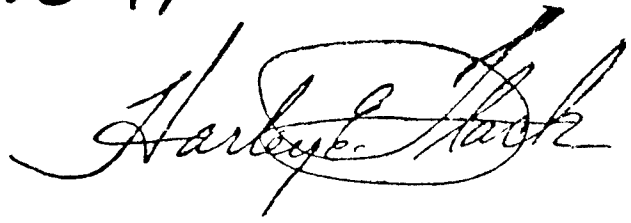

The Department of Health and Physical Education is developing a minor curriculum change for the three credit all-college requirement in health and physical education. The change will involve a realignment of semester hour allocations. Health and Physical Education I - Health and Wellness (HPE I) will increase from 1.5 semester hours to 2.0 semester hours. The Health and Physical Education - Fitness and Sport (HPE II) will decrease from 1.5 semester hours to 1.0 semester hour. The majority of the sections of HPE II would be scheduled on a quarter basis, although some sport and fitness offerings are more effectively taught using other time formats.

The rationale used by the members of the department curriculum committee include:

1. HPE I is an extensive classroom course with selected laboratories designed to provide students with the skills and knowledges important for designing and implementing effective strategies in lifestyle management. The interest in our society in the development and maintenance of personal health and fitness has resulted in an increase in the body of knowledge associated with this curricular area. The faculty who teach this course have expressed a need to increase the hours allocated for student for this portion of the all-college requirement.
2. Transfer students are more likely to have activity courses on their records with 1.0 semester credit hours for HPE II. This would provide better articulation with the two-year and four-year colleges.

The Curriculum Committee for Health and Physical Education would appreciate your reaction to this minor change in credit hours, if you identify any impact on your major program. This credit hour realignment will not change the number of semester hours students need to fulfill the all-college requirement in health and physical education.
