This course explores the principles of international trade and finance, commercial policies of developed and developing countries and international monetary arrangements. This course may not be offered annually.

This course studies the economic aspects of globalization taking place amongst countries through linkages of international trade and commerce, foreign direct investment, short term capital flows, institutional lending, immigration, emigration, knowledge, and technology. Emphasis will be placed on the economic processes and ramifications of globalization. This course may not be offered annually.

2. Rational:

a. Statements of "need" for such a change.

Traditionally, a course on International Economics exposes the students to the basic principles of international trade and finance with some attention to commercial policies and monetary arrangements.

Recently, the world has changed. There are more significant flows, which link countries together. To be current, we have to incorporate these new flows into our classroom presentation and student experience. Consequently, the old title and course description are out dated and do not reflect current experience, practice and knowledge.
