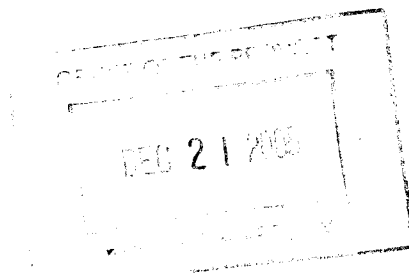

Minor Curricular Change to Existing Non-Gen-Ed Course

### Title and Description Changes – Journalistic Sources of Information (0602.318)

#### DETAILS

a. Changes requested for Journalistic Sources of Information (0602.318)

Title change:

*From* Journalistic Sources of Information

*To* Enterprise Journalism

Description change:

OLD: This course acquaints students with federal and state public records laws. They learn where to find and how to use public records at federal, state, county and local levels. Students investigate property records, records on public officials and business and nonprofit records.

NEW: (a sentence at the end) This course acquaints students with federal and state public records laws. They learn where to find and how to use public records at federal, state, county and local levels. Students investigate property records, records on public officials and business and nonprofit records. *They use this and other information to write long-form journalism articles.*

b. Sponsors: Kathryn Quigley, Assistant Professor, Journalism  
Carl Hausman, Professor, Journalism

#### RATIONALE

a. Need for change: The new title, Enterprise Journalism, more accurately reflects the current terminology used in journalism for this kind of reporting.

The description change is minor, but more accurately reflects the writing aspect of the course.

b. Curricular effect: This name change and description change will not alter the curriculum in any way. Instead, the added sentence more accurately describes the way the course is currently taught.

### TITLE CHANGES

The Journalism Department has discussed and unanimously agreed to change the titles of five of our Journalism courses. The title changes more accurately describe the content of the courses. Four of these courses were originally titled many years ago; the new titles reflect the current terminology.
