CURRICULAR EFFECT: The curriculum would otherwise be unchanged.

ADEQUACY OF PRESENT STAFF, RESOURCES, ETC.: This change has no impact on the number of sections taught by the existing faculty of the College of Business. Therefore, adequacy of resources is not an issue for this curriculum change.

RATIONALE: Many students sign up for College of Business courses and delay declaring a major in Business until the final semester of the senior year. This violates the Standards for Accreditation of Business Administration programs of AACSB - The International Association for Management Education, in which students pursuing undergraduate degree programs offered by the other Colleges of Rowan University are not permitted to take more than 25% of their baccalaureate program in course content or credit hours in subjects commonly available in a school of business. The students do themselves a disservice, as well, when they delay declaring a Business major. They deprive themselves of appropriate advisement and increase the risk that they will not graduate promptly.

RESULTS OF CONSULTATION: This was approved at a meeting of the College of Business leadership team.
