

2. Rationale

A. Need For Change:

Three of the courses (Juvenile Delinquency/Justice; Police and Correctional Administration) are being proposed for deletion because the department hopes to replace them with new courses. The department has proposed that Juvenile Delinquency/Justice be split into two courses, while Police and Correctional Administration will be joined into one comprehensive course, Criminal Justice Administration. Police supervision does not require separate existence. The material from this course can be adequately covered in Criminal Justice Administration. Finally, Planned Change has not been offered in years and the faculty sees little interest or need in continuing to carry this course in our curriculum.

B. Curricular Effect:

The department sees no curricular effect in deleting police and Correctional Administration, Police Supervision and Planned Change. Splitting the juvenile course will have a curricular effect. The Department is proposing to require both of the new juvenile courses. This will give our students fewer free electives within the major but the department is convinced that both new courses are vital to our students while the current course does not adequately cover the material.

3. Results of Consultation

The entire Law/Justice Studies Department concurs that these courses should be deleted from its curriculum.
