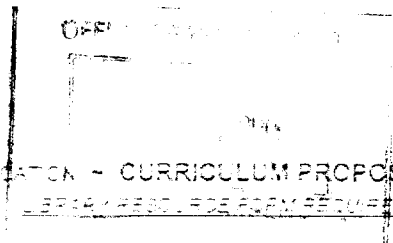

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## Minor Curricular Proposal: Changing HEGIS numbers for three Law and Justice Courses

### Details:

- a.
  1. Change Requested: Change HEGIS number of Introduction to Corrections from 2105.115 to a 200 level course. *200*
  2. Change Requested: Change HEGIS number of Introduction to Courts from 2105.110 to a 200 level. *201*
  3. Change requested: Change HEGIS number of American Police from 2105.105 to a 200 level. *202*
- b. Sponsor: Dr. Michael S. Vigorita

### Rationale

- a. Statement of Need:

Based on proposed changes in the required curriculum (as discussed in an additional proposal) these courses will become electives and will be taught at a more advanced level. A 200 level HEGIS number will better reflect the change in pedagogy.

- b. Curricular Effect:

Currently these courses are being offered three times per semester. As noted in a separate proposal, each course will be offered once per semester. Further, there are few 200 level courses within the department and the addition of these three will benefit our students by allowing them to take more courses at these higher levels.

- c. Changes in requirements:

These courses will now be electives (as proposed in a separate proposal). This proposal is only to change the HEGIS number of the course – it does not affect requirements.
