1. Change requested: Change the title of this in-depth specialization from "Information Processing" to "Management Information Systems." For this specialization list the courses set forth below.
2. Rationale: "Management Information Systems" is the more accurate and accepted terminology for developing and managing information flows to achieve organizational purposes. This structure establishes the courses required for a solid core of understanding in this area. The others would supplement. No new courses are included. This listing formally recognizes what has come to be the patterning of courses in this area.
3. Impact: More orderly guidance to students.
4. Consultation: Math Department has no objection to eliminating the courses being dropped.

1. Change Requested: Change the prerequisite for Programming in COBOL (0704.333) from 0704.331 (Concepts of Programming a Computer) to 0701.102 (Introduction to Computer Science).
2. Rationale: Introduction to Computer Science provides the basic computer and programming knowledge needed. Experience has shown this to be adequate background for Programming in COBOL. These are Administrative Studies courses.
3. Consultation: Math Department concurs



SUBJECT: Administrative Studies Curriculum Change

Administrative Studies has made some minor revisions in their specialization tracks. One of these revisions currently being reviewed by the Curriculum Committee is the removal of the two courses, "Computer Data Structures" and "Algorithm," and "Concepts of Programming a Computer" from the Information Processing Specialization.

The reason for these changes is the shift in emphasis, within this specialization, to a stronger management and systems orientation.

At the same time we have increased the number of General Education requirements. This will provide our students with more opportunity to take related programming courses.
