Minor Curricular Change

I. **DETAILS:**

- a. Course title change requested from "Masterpieces of English Literature" to "Readings in British Literature."
- b. Sponsors: Dr. Nathan R. Carb, Jr., English Department Chair; Dr. Catherine Wilcoxson, Department Curriculum Committee Chair.

II. **RATIONALE:**

- a. The term "Masterpieces" has elitist, hegemonic overtones implying cultural dominance or privilege. "English" literature is also a misleading term for this course, since it could be taken to mean any literature written in English (colonial or postcolonial literature from India, Rhodesia, etc.). We would also like to make the name of this course parallel other departmental offerings in British Literature.
- b. This change will have no impact on the program, department and/or curricular design.

III. **RESULTS OF CONSULTATION:**

- a. The entire English Department was consulted on this decision, and all assented on the name change.
- b. See attached copy of English Department Minutes for proof of consultation.

English Department Meeting
October 25, 1994

- I. Nathan Carb thanked Catherine Wilcoxson for her exemplary work as chair of the department's Curriculum Committee. The committee reported the following accomplishments and proposals:
- A. The department submitted updated and standardized syllabi for general education courses to NCATE.
 - B. A title change has been submitted to the Senate Curriculum Committee requesting that "Afro-American Literature" be re-titled "African-American Literature."
 - C. A minor in English will be submitted to the Senate Curriculum Committee next semester. Department members unanimously approved the minor, which will consist of 24 hours of designated classes:
 - 1. Introduction to Literary Studies
 - 2. one double survey (student chooses either US Lit. Before and Since Realism or British Lit. to and Since Romanticism.
 - 3. either Masterpieces of American Lit. or Masterpieces of English Literature, depending on the choice made under (2) above: having chosen US Lit. Before and Since Realism, the student would take Masterpieces of English Literature; having chosen British Lit. to and Since Romanticism, the student would take Masterpieces of American Literature.
 - 4. Shakespeare I
 - 5. Seminar I
 - 6. one 200-level elective: Women in Literature or African-American Literature
 - 7. one 300- or 400-level elective
 - D. Tim Viator is working on a new numbering system for classes offered in the English Dept.; he will check with the Registrar to determine difficulties with such a change.
 - E. After some discussion, the department voted unanimously to propose new titles for our former "Masterpieces" courses; we will now offer "Readings in World Literature," "Readings in U.S. Literature," and "Readings in British Literature."
