Minor Curriculum Change

Change in the Prerequisites and Level of Principles of Management (0506.303)

1. Details:

- a: Change the Prerequisite from *Junior Standing as Business Major* to *Communications I, Public Speaking* and *Microeconomics*.

Change the level from 300 to 200.

- b. Sponsor: Robert D. Lynch, Management/MIS Department

2. Rationale:

- a: Statement of “need” for such change: *Principles of Management*, is a prerequisite for many of the courses within the Management Specialization. This creates problems for many students who must wait until the second semester of their junior year to start required course sequences. In addition, we are faced with the dilemma of having community college agreements which require us to accept Principles of Management courses offered at the 2nd year level in community colleges.

- b. Statements of curricular effect: This should not have any significant impact on the curriculum or resources required.

3. Results of Consultation:

At a recent meeting between SOBA faculty and our AACSB (American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business) consultant, Dean Mark Sandberg of Rider University, we were told that this was a change that many AACSB accredited schools of business were making. Faculty within the SOBA were consulted and are in agreement with the change.
