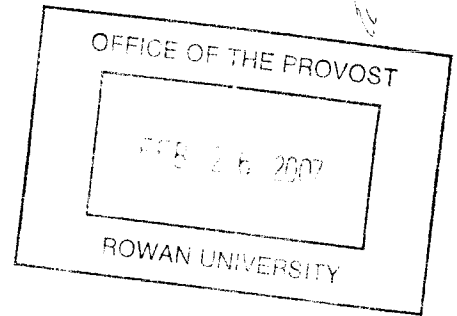

Global Proseminar in History

Details

- a Course Title: Global Proseminar in History, HIST 05430
- b Sponsor(s): Joy Wiltenburg, James Heinzen, History Department
- c Credit Hours:3
- d Course Level: 400
- e Prerequisites: Historical Methods, HIST 05 299
- f Suggested time and scale of implementation. Fall 2007; course will be offered most semesters

Curricular Effect

This is merely a course number change for clarification. It will have no curricular effect.

Rationale

The existing Proseminar in History (HIST 05429) is a shifting topics course that offers students in-depth coverage of a particular topic in a seminar setting. Some of the sections deal with global (non-Western) topics and therefore meet our departmental global requirement, while others do not. Specifying a separate course number for the global sections (HIST 05430) will enable students to tell immediately how a course fits into their program. It will also enable us to track student progress more effectively with the new computerized tools for assessing program completion.

Essence of the Course

The course currently exists and will be taught in the same way under the new course number.

Results of Consultations

History majors are the only students affected by this change. Dual majors in Education will also benefit. Consultation results will follow.

Catalog Description

HIST 05430 Global Proseminar in History

Prerequisite: 2205.299 or permission of instructor. This course introduces students to in-depth historical analysis of a selected theme in global history, including work with historical sources, critical reading of historians' accounts, intensive writing and class discussion. Past and proposed topics include the partition of Africa and Islamic reform movements.
