- I. SCIENTIFIC GERMAN
Department of Foreign Languages

- II. ESSENCE:
1. Undergraduate course
 2. Semester hours credit: 3
 3. Course Level: Sophomore
 4. Prerequisites: One year of German (high school or college) and approval of instructor.
 5. Position: An additional elective course.
 6. Suggested Time and Scale of Implementation: It could be given as an intensive course during Intersession or during the semester of Spring, 1975.
- III. OTHER DETAILS:
1. Staff and Resources: There is one Foreign Language Department faculty member qualified to teach this course. Basic library holdings such as scientific and technical dictionaries are already available. A journal of translation, such as Lebende Sprachen (by Langenscheidt), may be acquired as needed.
 2. Library facilities and needs: See above
 3. Space Needs: Any classroom
 4. Uniqueness: The aim of this course is to develop a reading knowledge of German for research in the sciences.
 5. Specific Objectives: To develop rapid reading and translation skill in the social and physical sciences. The topics will be chosen from a wide variety of scientific and technological fields.
- IV. RATIONALE: This course will fulfill an important need at Glassboro State College. It will be extremely helpful not only to the undergraduate science major, but also to graduate students who wish to acquire a reading knowledge of German for scientific research. It will also be valuable training for the Foreign Language major who later on would wish to concentrate on the field of technical and scientific translation.
- V. CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT: This course will be of extreme interest to undergraduate Science majors at Glassboro State College, as well as to graduate students seeking a knowledge of German for scientific research. The course will be added to the bank of offerings in General Education. Particular library holdings are currently available and the acquisition of additional materials will present no peculiar problems. A member of the Foreign Language Department is qualified to teach this course.
