### **RATIONALE**

- a. The Management/MiS Department is requesting this change in order to allow more students in the College of Business. These courses are “industry seminars” in which students are introduced to a specific industry (e.g., banking and finance or hospitality) in order to give the students the opportunity to decide whether the industry is one in which the students would like to pursue a career. Being able to enroll in these seminars earlier in their college careers permits students to make other course selections which contribute to career preparation.
- b. There will be no curricular effects on the Management program, the Management/MIS Department, or on the other curriculum available in the College of Business (COB). The course is now an elective for the Management curriculum. However, there is ample room in the courses for students in other COB curricula.
