2. Rationale

a. There was, apparently, a typographical error in the initial proposal that created these prerequisites. The hegis number for Design of Database Systems must have been incorrectly stated as 0702.334 when it should have been stated as 0702.338. (Note that 0702.334 is the hegis number for Management Information Systems.) Our advisement sheet (showing the course names without numbers) is attached to show that this was the original intent.)

b. There is no curricular effect. This is the set of prerequisites that was desired all along and for which faculty currently advise.
