Woven/Constructed Fiber Arts I.....Fiber Design I

Course No: 1009.215 3 s.h.

(Prerequisites: 1002.100, 1002.110, 1009.105, 1009.208 or consent of instructor)

This introductory course in weaving gives students a basic foundation in designing fiber construction. It explores textures, colors, and designs through working with threads, and includes such techniques as basic on-loom pattern weaves and two basic off-loom rug making methods. For Art Majors and/or consent of instructor. This course is required for Fiber Design Specializations.

Surface Fiber Arts I.....Fiber Design II

Course No: 1009.220 3 s.h.

(Prerequisites: 1002.100, 1002.110, 1009.105, 1009.208 or consent of instructor)

This introductory course in fabric design provides students with a basic foundation in designing two dimensional decorative fabrics by employing such techniques as linoleum blockprinting, batik, and tie-dyeing and free hand painting on fabric. For Art Majors and/or consent of instructor. This course is required for Fiber Design Specializations.

(Prerequisites: 1009.215, 1009.216, 1009.315 or consent of instructor)

The above three courses explores the areas of weaving in greater depth. By operating in three different levels, students can proceed according to their previous experience and study. Such techniques as advanced pattern weaves, tapestry weaves, double layer weaves, tubular weaves, knitting, crocheting, coiling, quilting, basketry, patchwork, stitchery, tropono, applique, looping, and much more are taught.



RE: Consolidation of Courses in the Fibers Area

I would like to state my support of the consolidation of the courses currently listed as Surface Fiber Art I through VIII and Woven/Constructed Fiber Art I through VIII as Fiber Design I through VIII.

In practice, the advanced courses in the fiber area have met together for many years and, in fact, are part of a unified program. Therefore, it seems logical that after an initial course in surface fiber design and woven/constructed fiber design, the remainder of the courses be listed under the title "Fiber Design." The courses of study were never designed to be complete programs in themselves, but rather part of what we now call the "Crafts" Specialization.
