Within the Non-Program Course area, it is preferred students complete 2 courses from the History/Humanities/Language bank and 4 courses from the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

1. Thirty-three semester hours (33 s.h.) in sociology are required for majors. These courses must be completed with a 2.5 grade point average.

2. Eighteen semester hours (18 s.h.) in sociology must be taken in courses designed for junior or senior level students (300, 400 or 500 level).

3. Five sociology courses (15 s.h.) are required for sociology majors:

Introduction to Sociology (3 s.h.), Classical Sociological Theory (3 s.h.), Sociological Research Methods (3s.h.), Social Statistics (3 s.h.), and Senior Seminar (3 s.h.).

Since Introduction to Sociology is a prerequisite for all other courses in the department (except Sociology of the Family, Social Problems, and Self and Society), it is highly recommended that this course be completed prior to the student's junior year.

Classical Sociological Theory has a prerequisite of Introduction to Sociology and 3 s.h. in sociology;

Sociological Research Methods and Social Statistics both have a prerequisite of Introduction to Sociology.

Senior Seminar has the prerequisites Classical Sociological Theory, Sociological Research Methods and Social Statistics
