Students must also take the following: One Rowan Seminar (excluding transfers), one Multicultural/Global Studies (M/G), one Writing Intensive (WI), one Broad-based Literature, one Artistic and Creative Experience (ACE), and one Public Speaking course. **M/G, LIT, ACE, WI and RS courses that are taken within the major program of study DO NOT COUNT towards this minimum total of 42 credits. Sociology majors are required to take 30 credits in upper level courses: 18 must be in Sociology.** Courses may be transferred from Community Colleges up to a maximum of 67 hours; all such transfers are counted as lower-level courses. Students must have a 2.0 overall GPA as well as a 2.0 GPA in sociology courses taken at Rowan.
