The Resident Director Position:

Resident Directors (RDs) at Rowan University are full-time graduate students working on a live-in basis to manage an assigned residence hall or apartment community. RDs provide supervision of a Resident Assistant staff, oversight of co-curricular programming and associated budgets, as well as coordination of facilities operations in their community to provide a high level of customer service for our resident students.

Your experience as a Graduate Resident Director will give you the opportunity to develop strong professional skills and prepare you for your future in student affairs or many other career fields!



Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree.
- One year of related/transferrable experience.
- Residence life, or related student leadership experience in a university setting is preferred.
- Experience as a Resident Assistant strongly preferred for RD position.
- Sensitivity to and ability to work with students, faculty, and staff of diverse backgrounds.
- Must be admitted to a graduate program at the university.
- Preference is given to candidates with career goals in student affairs/higher education.
