In other words, if your student chooses to live off campus, she/he will not have the privilege to park overnight on campus between the hours of 2:00 am – 6:00 am.

For your consideration, several of the nearby apartment complexes do not have sufficient parking for their residents. Therefore, we are encouraging students to have a frank discussion regarding parking availability with their potential landlord **before** signing a lease.
