

Rowan University is a selective, medium-sized public institution located in southern New Jersey, just 20 miles east of Philadelphia, with a branch campus in nearby Camden. With high-tech facilities, engaged professors and nationally ranked academic and athletic programs, Rowan offers an outstanding education at an exceptional value.

Rowan's most recent major initiatives include the creation of the South Jersey Technology Park of Rowan University, the development of Cooper Medical School of Rowan University and the construction of Rowan Boulevard, a public-private partnership to create a mixed-use roadway that links the University to Glassboro's historic downtown.

Academics

Students have access to the resources of a large university without sacrificing the personal attention and small class size of a college. All classes are taught by professors, not teaching assistants. The average class size is 20 students and the student/faculty ratio is 15 to 1.

The University offers 80 undergraduate majors among seven colleges Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, Fine & Performing Arts, Liberal Arts & Sciences and Graduate & Continuing Education. Graduate students can choose from 55 majors leading to master's degree; seven professional certification programs; 26 graduate certification of graduate study programs; six teacher certification programs, and a doctoral program in educational leadership.

Accolades

Rowan has been recognized by national organizations that evaluate colleges and universities.

Athletics

Rowan has one of the strongest NCAA Division III athletics programs in the nation, earning 11 national championships.

Admission

Students entering the University in 2010 had an average SAT score of 1173 and were ranked in the top 20 percent of their high school class.

The deadline for freshman and transfer applications for the fall semester is March 1. Students who apply to the College of Fine & Performing Arts must arrange an audition or portfolio review. Student Body

The University enrolls more than 11,600 full- and part-time students who represent the Mid-Atlantic States and 30 foreign countries. More than 100 clubs and organizations offer students professional, cultural and service activities. Students and faculty regularly win national recognition, usually competing with larger universities.

Facilities

Our tree-lined, 200-acre main campus contains student residence halls, apartments and townhouses, a new \$28.5 million education building, a new \$45 million science center, one of the newest and largest student recreation centers in the state and the only planetarium in South Jersey. Wireless Internet access is available throughout campus, in- and outdoors.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

Approximately 7,575 students received assistance in fall 2010. More than \$110 million was awarded, with \$89 million in loans, \$24 million in grants and \$5.8 million awarded in scholarships. More than 70% of our students receive assistance


Campus Tours
