Spanish Placement Testing and Authorization for Credit by Exam

If you have previously studied or learned Spanish and would like to skip lower-level courses, you may take the STAMP 4S exam (\$19.90 fee). Students may then purchase the credits for the courses they would skip, and these credits are accepted as free electives toward graduation (\$105 fee to purchase 3 credits, \$135 for 6 credits, \$165 for 9 credits, and \$195 for 12 credits, paid to Rowan's Bursar).
